

B. School Dress Standards

Students, faculty, and staff at The Gregory School are expected to dress in a way that is not distracting to the school's academic atmosphere. The school expects students, faculty, and staff to maintain a standard of dress and appearance that is appropriate to an academic setting and to The Gregory School mission but also allows for the expression of individual tastes.

For the 2018-2019 school year, school dress standards are:

Appropriate Dress:

- Shorts must cover the buttocks
- Dresses and skirts must cover the buttocks
- Shoes must be worn at all times (may include flip-flops)
- Clothing must cover the torso, breast, breast cleavage, bras, and other undergarments at all times
- Ripped shorts and pants; must not expose any private parts

Inappropriate Dress:

- Sheer, net, or transparent fabrics that expose undergarments
- Logos or pictures that represent implicit or explicit references to sex, alcohol, drugs, tobacco, weapons, or illegal activity
- Hats and sunglasses worn inside
- Garments that expose torso, breast, breast cleavage, bras, undergarments, buttocks, such as short shorts, crop tops, volleyball spandex

Consequences for dress code violations:

First-warning—parents notified in writing

Second-students will be asked to change into appropriate clothing—parents notified

Excessive violations will result in consequences from the Head of School
